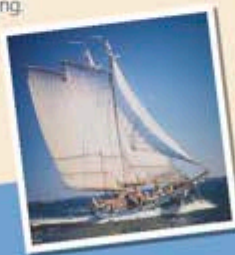

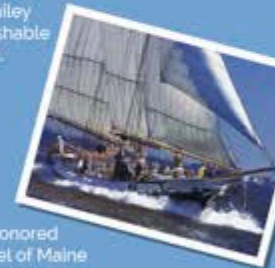
Grace Bailey is a sailboat with a very special heritage. Constructed at Patchogue, Long Island in 1882, she is an authentic American lumber-carrier, directly from the age of sail.

After decades of efficiently transporting yellow pine along the Eastern Seaboard, Grace Bailey then also proved fast enough to carry perishable foods and fruits to and from the Caribbean.

Learn the History

During the World War II era, Grace Bailey honored our nation as the primary sail-training vessel of Maine Maritime Academy, famously located in Castine, still among our cruising grounds.

And today, Grace Bailey's rugged design translates directly into broad and uncrowded decks. With an incredible 24' beam (width), you'll find the comfort and the space to sunbathe or just take in island views!

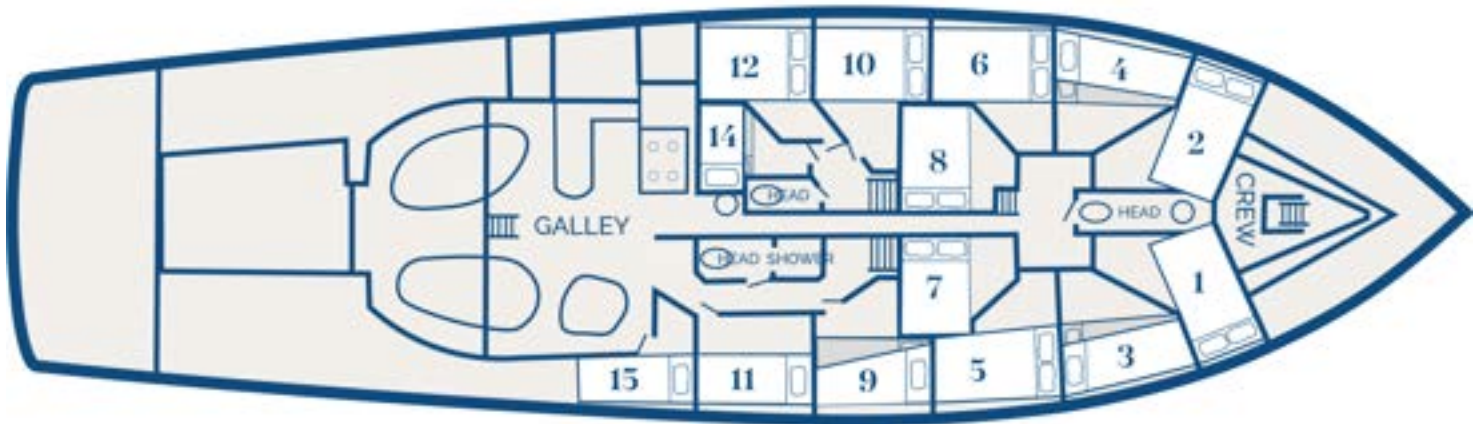

The vessel is framed and planked with white oak, with a deck of long leaf yellow pine. It carries neither inboard engines nor powered deck machinery, propulsion when needed being provided by a small yawlboat with an inboard motor. She carries 1000 gallons of fresh water and is equipped with three public heads and a hot shower.

There is a centerboard with its centerboard trunk, the main mast being offset somewhat from the center line of the hull to accommodate the width of the trunk. The only significant alteration to the schooner lies in the substitution of companion ways for cargo hatches and the installation of staterooms below decks.

GRACE BAILEY was built in Patchogue, Long Island, New York, in 1882 by Oliver Perry Smith, and named for owner Edwin Bailey's daughter, Grace, born that year. In 1906, GRACE BAILEY was rebuilt and renamed for Mr. Bailey's granddaughter, Martha, nicknamed Mattie. From 1906 until 1990, the schooner sailed as Mattie, but in the spring of 1990, after restoration, was returned to her original name.
